- a) by residence (State/Territory)
- b) by locality (Urban, Regional, Rural)

Answer:

a) Table A provides a breakdown of disability types and Table B provides a breakdown of children by state/territory as at 31 May 2012. Privacy protocols prevent reporting numbers of children by state/territory and disability type as this level of reporting has the potential to lead to the identification of some individuals.
