Question:

a) Senator FIFIELD: As part of the unification were there new name badges?

Ms Campbell: There were.

Senator FIFIELD: How many new name badges were there?

Ms Campbell: Everyone got one.

Senator FIFIELD: They are of no use to anyone else other than the individual.

Ms Campbell: I do not think that we will have that as figures on hand but we can take that on notice.

Senator FIFIELD: And name plates? Do people have name plates for doors and desks?

Ms Campbell: Yes. They were provided with those. We will take that on notice.

b) Senator FIFIELD: How many were redone because of people's payroll names being used rather than their stage names?

Ms Bennett: I will have to take on notice whether we are able to tell that.

Answer:

- a) On 1 July 2011, all Department of Human Services staff (37,885) were provided with individually personalised name badges and desk plates.
- b) Where recorded on the Department's HR system, preferred names were used. Whilst some had to be redone, the numbers were small (less than 200 or 0.5 per cent).
