OUTCOME 11.1 - Mental Health BRE Description	BRE Activities
Mental Health More Options Better Outcomes - BRE030	This BRE funds the Access to Allied Psychological Services (ATAPS) program.
	This BRE comprises the Commonwealth's core funding to beyondblue for the National Depression initiative.
National Depression Initiative - BRE035  National Mental Health Program - BRE038	The National Mental Health Program (NMHP) supports the achievement of outcomes under the National Mental Health Strategy. A range of mental health promotion and prevention activities are funded through this program, including funding for mental health consumer organisations and projects focused on reducing stigma and improvir mental health awareness.
	The National Suicide Prevention Program (NSPP) funds suicide prevention activities across the Australian population and for specific at-risk groups. Funding from this program also supports suicide prevention activities under ATAPS and Mindmatters
National Suicide Prevention Program - BRE040	This BRE funds headspace, which provides a national coordinated focus on youth mental health and related drug and alcohol problems and aims to improve access for young people aged 12-25 years to appropriate services and ensure better coordinatio between services.
	This BRE funds the Day to Day Living Program, which aims to improve the quality of I for individuals with severe and persistent mental illness by providing support for those who experience social isolation and increasing their ability to participate in social,
COAG Mental Health - support for day-to-day living in the community - BRE413  COAG Mental Health - Additional Education Places Scholarships and Clinical Training in Mental Health - BRE414	Under this BRE funding is provided for clinical psychology scholarships under the Nursing and Allied Health Scholarship and Support Scheme (NAHSSS). Funding is all provided to the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatry (RANZCP) to manage specialist training to enhance training networks and assist trainees to attain
COAG Mental Health - support for children - BRE415	This BRE supports mental health promotion, prevention and early intervention for all children through universal evidence-based school and early childhood programs and fit those children who are at highest risk of developing mental health problems, or who have early signs, symptoms or diagnosis of mental health problems through targeted programs. Examples of initiatives funded under this program include Kidsmatter and the National Eating Disorders Collaboration.
OAG Mental Health - telephone counselling - BRE416	Funding under this BRE is to increase the provision of evidence-based telephone and web-based counselling services and expand online interactive tools for people living with mental illness.
lational Perinatal Depression Plan - BRE527	This BRE aims to improve the prevention and early detection of antenatal and postnat depression and provide better support and treatment for expectant and new mothers experiencing depression. Services are delivered by state and territory governments supported by beyondblue, and funding is also provided to the ATAPS program.
laternity Peer Support - BRE635	Through this BRE funding is provided to specialist organisations to provide telephone- based support for women experiencing post or antenatal depression, or grief following the loss of a baby.
eadership in Mental Health Reform - BRE644	The Leadership in Mental Health Reform program funds a range of activities including National Mental Health Report, National Minimal Data Sets for Mental Health and national surveys.
arly Psychosis Prevention and Intervention - BRE686	Through this BRE funding is provided to headspace and Orygen for the delivery of ear psychosis youth services based on the EPPIC model.
aking Action to Tackle Suicide - BRE720 (Also BRE764 non indexed component)	This BRE comprises four streams of activity to provide more services for those at risk of suicide:  1. Providing more services and support for men  2. Taking action to prevent suicide and boost crisis intervention services  3. Promoting good mental health and resilience in young people  4. Boosting frontline services to support those at risk.
	This BRE supports a network of eight specialist torture and trauma rehabilitation agencies in each state and territory of Australia to provide specialised mental health support to humanitarian entrants to Australia who are experiencing psychological and/opsychosocial difficulties relating to pre migration experiences of torture and trauma.
	Under this BRE funding is to expand the existing Medicare Healthy Kids Check to include consideration of emotional wellbeing and development, and to bring forward the check from four year olds to three year olds.
	The Partners in Recovery program aims to improve the system response to, and outcomes for, people with a severe and persistent mental illness who have complex needs by getting the services and supports from multiple sectors they may come into contact with (and could benefit from) to work in a more collaborative, coordinated and integrated way.
	This BRE funds a component of the Tasmanian Assistance Package for innovative and flexible approaches that address gaps in the Tasmanian mental health system or targe populations not traditionally served well by mainstream approaches.
	This BRE provides funding for mental health nurses to provide sessions of coordinated clinical services.
