The cost incurred by FaHCSIA for seven delegates, including four non-government members, was \$149,404.

What are the expected or realised benefits of taking each of the delegation members to the CSW?

The Commission did not agree to conclusions in 2012. It was also unable to reach agreement on the issue of violence against women and girls the last time this had been a Priority Theme in 2003. The aim of the delegation was to secure agreement on Conclusions that reflected Australia's position on violence against women and commitment to the elimination of violence against women and girls. Agreement was secured.
