Answer:

The Department has implemented a FaHCSIA-specific Protective Security Management Framework which is designed to provide a practical, risk-based approach to either eliminate or reduce the threats and risks to the Department to an acceptable level.

FaHCSIA's Protective Security Management Framework aligns with the 33 Australian Government's mandatory Protective Security Policy Framework requirements. The Department will officially report against these requirements in August 2013.
