Question:

Given that Aboriginal people generally access Medicare and PBS funding at lower rates than the non-Aboriginal population of Australia, how does the Government calculate the total Medicare and PBS component of the projected \$920 million it claims will be spent on the provision of health programmes specifically for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people?

Answer:

In 2014-15 more than \$920 million will be spent on the provision of health programmes specifically for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. This includes Medicare and access to pharmaceuticals through the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS).

The Medicare component of these projections takes Indigenous specific items on the Medicare Benefits Scheme (MBS) and forecasts services and expenditure using the MBS time series model. This model uses Holt-Winters exponential smoothing on the number of services per capita* per working day**. The forecast services are multiplied by average benefits per service indexed by WCI5***. This methodology is used consistently for all MBS related forecasts.

The PBS funding rate is forecast having regard to the growth rate and usage of services under the Remote Area Aboriginal Health Services Programme, and indicative allocations made on a yearly basis under the Quality Use of Medicines Maximised in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples Programme.
