Senator FARRELL: I am not asking you to do this now but could you provide us with a breakdown of the staff at the ASC, including the basic details of what they do and what payment and they sit under. Ms Palmer: Yes. Senator FARRELL: And could you also specify which staff are employed specifically to run the day-to-day operations at the AIS. Ms Palmer: Yes.

Answer:

The Australian Spots Commission (ASC) workforce comprises of 570 FTE. Staff are generally represented across four key areas of high performance, participation, corporate operations and site services.

The ASC plays a central leadership role in the development and operation of Australian sport including administering and funding innovative sport programs and providing leadership, coordination and support for the sport sector.

The ASC has a diverse workforce which includes a broad spectrum of roles including:

- sports sciences and sports medicine
- other athlete support services such as psychology, nutrition, health and wellbeing
- coach and sport leader development
- sports participation and community engagement
- business finance, investment and marketing
- policy development and consultancy
- communications and government relations
- legal and human resources.
