Question:

What is the average and the mean wait times for ACAT and RAS assessments, by assessment area and by priority for the period 1 July to 31 December 2016? And for the period 1 January 2017 to 30 June 2017?

Answer:

In accordance with the Australian Bureau of Statistics advice, the Department of Health uses the median average, as the most relevant statistical measure for averages as it is less subject to data variance then the mean average.

<u>Table 1</u> provides the median average and mean average wait times for Aged Care Assessment Team (ACAT) assessments for the period 1 July to 31 December 2016.

<u>Table 2</u> provides the median average for Regional Assessment Service (RAS) assessments for the period 1 July to 31 December 2016. Mean data is not currently available.

Jurisdictions and assessment organisations are required to provide the Department with six monthly performance reports. The next reporting period is January to June 2017 which will be subject to a validation process.
