Question:

What allocation is made by the government for administration costs of each Primary Health Network?

Answer:

Operational funding is provided to each Primary Health Network (PHN) for its core program functions. These functions go beyond business administration.

The core functions of the PHN include all elements of the commissioning cycle: understanding health care needs of the region through analysis, assessment and planning, design and procurement of activities through contracts, monitoring of service delivery and review and evaluation. The PHN also provides practice support services in attaining high standards in safety and quality in primary care, building capability and connectivity of digital health systems and primary care system transformation and integration. Operational funding is also provided for the support of governance structures (which include a skills based board as well as Clinical Councils and Community Advisory Committees) and all corporate support and administration activity.

The allocation of funding is specific to each PHN and based on geographical characteristics such as the number of GPs in the region, population and rurality.

A breakdown of core operational funding by PHN is in the table below.
