Question:

Given the significant failings of the current accreditation process do you not think the development of a single set of standards should be halted and a new approach developed in response to the findings of the independent report?

Answer:

The health, safety and wellbeing of older people who reside in aged care services is of paramount importance to the Australian Government.

In response to recent quality of care issues, an independent review of the Commonwealth's national aged care quality regulatory processes has been commissioned to consider the accreditation, monitoring, review, investigation, complaints and compliance processes to ensure that the regulatory system in residential aged care works effectively.

It would be inappropriate for the Department of Health to speculate or pre-empt the findings of the Review of National Aged Care Quality Regulatory Processes. The Department will not be looking to finalise work on the single set of aged care standards until the review has reported.
