Question:

\$47 million Suicide Prevention Leadership and Support Program:

Can the Department provide details regarding when this funding program went to tender and the date the Minister signed off on the successful recipients? Can the Department also provide a list of successful recipients by state and territory, the individual funding amounts received by each of the successful recipients and a description of what initiative(s) the funding will be used for each of the successful recipients?

Answer:

The invitation to apply for grant funding under the National Suicide Prevention Leadership and Support Program (the Program) opened on 2 August 2016 and closed on 13 September 2016. On 20 December 2016, the First Assistant Secretary, Health Services Division, as the delegate, approved the outcome of the grant funding round.

The Department of Health has entered into funding agreements with all successful grant recipients under the Program. Grant funding of \$43,063,058 (GST Exclusive) has been awarded to 16 projects from 1 April 2017 to 30 June 2019 for the delivery of suicide prevention activities that are applicable on a national scale. As such, successful grant recipients or funding is unable to be broken down by state or territory.
