Question:

Participation funding in the 2017-18 Investment Allocation seems to be heavily skewed towards sports that will feature in the 2020 Olympics (or in the case of Squash, the 2018 Commonwealth Games) - Is that deliberate and if so can you please detail the funding criteria that this is based on?

Answer:

2017-18 Australian Sports Commission (ASC) participation investment has been determined utilising the ASC's participation investment categorisation framework (announced in May 2015), with a fixed funding amount per category.

The categorisation of sports has been based on participation data from the ASC's national participation survey (AusPlay) and data gathered through the ASC's Annual Sports Performance Review (full active and exposure categories).

The participation investment categorisation framework data thresholds for 2017/18 are:
