Referencing QON SQ17-000494 from February 2017 Estimates:

- a) The Department was asked three questions (Part V) that asked for the service delivery compared to non service delivery (planning needs analysis, tender costs, consultants, administration etc) costs. This was not answered. Please provide the answers.
- b) What guidelines were given to PHN's regarding the amount to be spent on activities like needs analysis, tender set up costs and other non- service delivery activities?
- c) What mechanisms have the Department of Health put in place to check if PHNs are compliant with these guidelines or to monitor the level of non-service delivery expenditure? (ie how much of the money is being 'chewed up' in bureaucracy?)
- d) The answers provide a breakdown of allocation by PHN and by State. How were these breakdowns determined (population of needs)?
- i. If by needs, how were 'needs' determined?

Answer:

a) Operational funding is provided to PHNs for the administrative, governance and core functions of PHNs. PHNs receive an operational allowance to undertake these functions as part of the Drug and Alcohol Treatment Program.

As part of the drug and alcohol treatment funding provided to PHNs under the *National Ice Action Strategy* (NIAS), \$9,871,200 (GST exclusive) of the \$177.1 million three-year total in contract has been allocated to PHNs for their operational budget. Funding for 2019-20 will be contracted at a later stage.

The operational allocation provided to each individual PHN is listed at <u>Attachment A</u>.

b) The PHN Program Guidelines outline the intentions of PHN operational funding and provide information on activities that are not eligible for operational funding. The program guidelines are available on the Department's website.

- c) PHNs must include a budget for their operational allowance in their annual Activity Work Plans, to be approved by the Department before commencement of commissioning/procurement. PHN Twelve Month Performance Reports must include an audited Income and Expenditure Statement and Financial Declarations confirming that their operational funding has been used in accordance with its intended purpose.
- d) The overall drug and alcohol funding model allocated funding according to 2011 Census data, and applies a cumulative weighting for rurality, socioeconomic disadvantage and Indigenous population.

The Indigenous-specific component (\$78.6 million) of the drug and alcohol funding is allocated to PHNs solely on Indigenous population, using the 2013 Estimated Resident Population to allocate the funding allocation. This model does not include any other weighting for rurality or socioeconomic disadvantage.

These approaches to funding allocations were finalised in consultation with key drug and alcohol experts, including Indigenous representation.
