OUTCOME 4: Aged Care and Population Ageing

Topic: BED SPACES

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Senator Siewert asked:

As at 30 June 2010:

- a) What is the proportion of allocated residential places that have been converted to community care places by state and nationally?
- b) What is the proportion of operational aged care places in each state?
- c) What is the number and the percentage of the national total of allocated places that are not operational by state?
- d) How many provisionally allocated places have lapsed and how many have been relinquished?

Answer:

a) See Table 1 below. Please note there have been no Exchange of Care Type submissions for community care places approved in the Australian Capital Territory, the Northern Territory, South Australia or Tasmania from 1 July 2009 to 30 June 2010.
