Senator Fierravanti-Wells asked:

- a) What is the gender ratio on each board across the portfolio?
- b) What is the gender ratio of appointments made to boards since Budget Estimates 2010?
- c) Are you implementing the Government target of 40 per cent women appointed to Boards?

## Answer:

a) There are seven governing boards within the Department of Health and Ageing portfolio. The gender ratio as at 2 November 2010 is:

Private Health Insurance Administration Council: 1 Female 2 Males
