Written Question on Notice

Senator Fierravanti-Wells asked:

- a) What impact has national registration had on overseas trained medical practitioners working in areas of need?
- b) How many overseas trained doctors will be affected by changes to registration requirements who are currently working in areas of need?

## Answer:

The 'Area of Need' (AON) Program has been implemented to allow doctors who hold conditional medical registration to practise in unfilled medical vacancies in each State and Territory. The AoN Program is administered by the State and Territory Health Departments within their respective jurisdictions.

a) The National Registration and Accreditation Scheme is not a Commonwealth scheme, it is a national scheme. The legislative framework for the Scheme is an applied laws model. Queensland, as the lead state, introduced the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act 2009 (Qld)* (the National Law) which established new national boards and detailed the substantive provisions for registration and accreditation. The National Law was then applied in the remaining states and territories except Western Australia, which enacted a corresponding law. The Department therefore is unable to provide this information.

The Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) is responsible for providing administrative support to the ten national health practitioner boards, including managing the registration processes for health practitioners and students around Australia and publishing national registers of practitioners.
