**Senator FIFIELD:** Just in a similar vein, the response to another question on notice in relation to staff misconduct, answer HS12, provides a table, a breakdown by category, of the type of breach.

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Could you take on notice from that period until now as well.

#### Answer:

HS12 provided information for the 2010-11 financial year. Cases not resolved in the financial year are added into the next financial year report.

#### Code of Conduct data for the 2011-12 financial year (as at 31 October 2011)

Note: A total has not been provided as an individual investigation may be counted against more than one type of misconduct.

There were 89 Code of Conduct investigations finalised in the period 1 July to 31 October 2011. Of these, 62 resulted in a finding of a breach of the APS Code of Conduct. In 12 cases no breach was found, and 15 employees resigned prior to the completion of their case.
