Written Question on Notice

Senator Boyce asked:

- a) Has the Department/Agency received any advice on how to respond to FOI requests?
- b) How many FOI requests has the Department received for the year 2010-2011? How many have been granted or denied?
- c) How many conclusive certificates have been issued in relation to FOI requests for the year 2010-2011?
- d) How many FOI requests has the Department received for this FYTD? How many have been granted or denied?
- e) How many conclusive certificates have been issued in relation to FOI requests for this FYTD?

## Answer:

a) The Australian Information Commissioner has issued guidelines for the purposes of the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (FOI Act). The Department of Health and Ageing must have regard to the guidelines in the performance of functions and exercise of powers under the FOI Act. The Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet provided Guidance Notes to all Departments on 28 July 2011. Moreover, legal advice is obtained from internal and external lawyers on particular FOI requests from time to time.
