Written Question on Notice

Senator Fierravanti-Wells asked:

- a) How many staff sit within the GP Super Clinics Branch in the Department of Health and Ageing? In total and by full time equivalent
- b) How many staff within the Department of Health and Ageing are working on the GP Super Clinics Program? In total and by full time equivalent

## Answer:

- a) As at 14 November 2011, there are a total of 42 staff, (37.9 full-time equivalent staff) within the GP Super Clinics Branch in the Department of Health and Ageing working on a mix of GP Super Clinics and Primary Care Infrastructure Grants which are part of the GP Super Clinics Program. This excludes staff on long-term leave (such as maternity leave, secondment or leave without pay) whose position is nominally held within the GP Super Clinics Branch
- b) As at 14 November 2011, in addition to the staff identified in a) above, there is a total of 20 staff, (19.3 full-time equivalent staff) working on Primary Care Infrastructure Grants in the Primary Care Infrastructure and Support Branch.
