**Topic:** Carer Eligibility and 25-Hour Rule

**Senator Siewert** asked:

Eligibility for Carer Payment imposes strict 25 hour limits. This can be difficult, especially for young people of schooling age, who assist with the care of parents.

For 2009-10 and 2010-11 provide data on the numbers of people denied eligibility for Carer Payment (adult and child) under this restriction.

Is the Department aware of cases of young people juggling school hours, regularly missing school, to meet these requirements?

**Answer:**

Below is data on Carer Payment rejections for carers working more than 25 hours for the 2009-10 and 2010-11 financial years.

**Carer Payment (Adult and Child) Rejections.**

	<b>Rejections</b> Due to carer working, volunteering, or studying/training for more than 25 hours a week
<b>2009-10</b>	2,287
<b>2010-11</b>	2,398
