#### **Question:**

Senator SMITH: In the annual report at page 160 you talk about the work you did in regard to the pilot of drought reform measures in Western Australia. From a policy perspective, this was a question I asked of your colleagues at FaHCSIA this morning. The report refers to the lower south-west region of Western Australia, but I take it to mean that this measure took in those districts surrounding Esperance, Hopetoun, Salmon Gums, Ravensthorpe, is that correct, which is not the south-west, it is more the south-east part of Western Australia?

Mr Sandison: We will take that on notice about which of the local government areas were involved.


Senator SMITH: Great, to make sure we are talking about the same things.

#### **Answer:**

The Australian Government, in partnership with the Western Australian Government, conducted a pilot of drought reform measures in part of Western Australia from 1 July 2010 to 30 June 2011. A map of the original pilot region is at Attachment A.

The pilot was extended from 1 July 2011 for 12 months. At that time, the pilot region was also expanded to include the region covering the south west of Western Australia.

A full listing of the Local Government Areas included in the pilot region from 1 July 2010 to 30 June 2011 (Part A) and those added following the extension from 1 July 2011 (Part B) is at Attachment B.
