As at 31 August 2012, there had been a total of approximately 2.3 million presentations to GPs, nurses and allied health professionals at operational GP Super Clinics and those providing early services.

This figure includes approximately 1.6 million presentations at the (then) 28 operational GP Super Clinics. Of these, there were approximately 1.2 million presentations that were for GP services and approximately 400,000 presentations for nursing/allied health services.
