## **Senator Siewert** asked:

Has this move to single manner panels resulted in any savings or efficiencies for the SSAT? Please provide details of any identified savings.

## **Answer:**

Yes. Each application for review heard by a member sitting alone results in a lesser cost to the SSAT than if two members heard the review.

The saving in constituting the SSAT by one member rather than by two members results in a saving in members' time ranging from two hours to many hours depending on the extent of preparation for, and length of, the hearing. There is also a reduction in the costs associated with photocopying hearing papers for members and postage of papers to part-time members.
