DWS RECOVERY OVERVIEW REPORT 1

NSW BUSHFIRES 17 OCT AS AT 29 OCT 1600HRS

SITUATION

Following a lengthy response phase to a number of major bushfires affecting multiple LGA's across NSW since 13 October 2013, the Welfare Services Functional area has now moved its focus to Disaster Welfare Recovery operations.

- In the Blue Mountains, the Linksview Road Fire severely impacted parts of the Springwood, Winmalee and Yellow Rock areas with substantial property losses occurring. 193 homes were completely destroyed with a further 109 sustaining damage. There was no loss of life during this event.
- The Mount York Fire impacted the north-western part of Mount Victoria where 7 houses were lost and one damaged.
- The State Mine Fire impacted the village of Mount Irvine, where two properties were lost.
- In the Hunter /Central Coast, the Hank Street fire (Port Stephens) resulted in six habitable dwellings sustaining damage and three habitable dwellings were destroyed and three were damaged in the Ruttley's Road Fire.

The loss of a substantial number of properties has resulted in many displaced people and companion animals. These displaced residents were initially supported by Disaster Welfare Services, Community Partners and the Department of Primary Industries through multiple evacuation centres which have now all closed.

This report outlines Disaster Welfare Recovery Operations primarily relating to teams stationed in the Blue Mountains.

CURRENT OPERATIONS

A Recovery Centre has been established at the Springwood Presbyterian Hall at 160 Macquarie St Springwood from which a team of 10 Alumni Disaster Welfare Officers (DWO's) are based. To date the team have conducted 152 interviews at the centre resulting in 11 Disaster Relief grant applications being issued of which 11 completed applications have been received. 13 home visit inspections have also been conducted as part of the application process for these grants.

From today the DWO's have also commenced a telephone contact strategy with the purpose of providing information about Recovery Centre services and the Disaster Relief Grant scheme as well as identifying individuals who may require on going support.

The DWS Alumni Manager is also represented on the Recovery Committee and a number of Sub Committees to provide and receive information and support for the community and provide input to recovery planning.

DRCN

Throughout the response phase of these emergencies the Disaster Recovery Chaplaincy Network have been heavily engaged in and working closely with NSW Mental health to support disaster affected people in a number of evacuation centres. One Chaplain spent over an hour with a war veteran who suffered a trauma attack from helicopters flying overhead and another with a lady who hadn't driven for 13 years but had loaded up her car and drove to the evacuation centre at Lithgow.

DRCN have also been engaged to provide support at the Recovery Centre at Springwood.

Save the Children Australia

Save the Children (SCA) were initially activated by DWS to establish child friendly spaces (CFS) in a number of evacuation centres and later in the Recovery Centre at Springwood by the Recovery Committee. The SCA team have had up to 13 children through the CFS on any given day. Respite was the top request from parents. Some were emotional and exhausted and came by the space to express that what they really need right now is "a break, a nanny". One mother left her daughter for the first time since Thursday at the Child Friendly Space to do groceries,

saying her daughter had clung on to her since the fire but now she was at least having fun with other children. Another young girl who lost everything in the fire came to the space to celebrate her birthday.

Numbers of children presenting at the recovery centre have since declined with the return to school yesterday and SCA staff reverted to standby as needed.

Outreach

Outreach commenced in the most fire affected area of Winmalee on Saturday 26 October and is being coordinated by two DWS Alumni and delivered by 40 volunteers from Red Cross and Anglicare. To date this has resulted in visits to 2,422 properties of which contact was made with 1,294 residents. As well as providing referrals to the Recovery Centre and information to the Recovery Committee, Outreach volunteers are also identifying people who do not require a formal referral but who could benefit from or appreciate a follow up visit in a week or so. Volunteers report that the people they are identifying are showing signs of stress and or anxiety which may subside once services are restored or they have finished cleaning. A process has been put in place to track follow up visits.

Lithgow Red Cross along with one DWS Alumni is delivering Outreach to the affected areas of Lithgow today including the community of Clarence near the Zig Zag Track.

Hunter Central Coast

A team of three DWS Alumni had been based in the Hunter Central Coast to conduct Outreach and assess referrals for Disaster Relief Grants. Outreach was conducted in conjunction with Red Cross to the communities of Swansea, Salt Ash, Williamtown, Cams wharf, Nords wharf, Catherine Hill Bay, Port Stephens, Gloster and Lake Munmorah.

A total of 3 Disaster relief grants have been issued and received completed and the DWS team from this area have now stood down.
