- iii) There are currently no contractors in the Communication Division.
- iv) There are four graphic designers in the Service Delivery Transformation Division. The role of the graphic designers as technical specialists is to translate communication material into visual designs suitable for printing and the online/electronic environment.
- v) The department has one Senior Executive Service media manager, the National Manager, Media Management and Executive Communication. The media manager leads the department's media and issues management activities.
- vi) One staff member is responsible for overseeing the management of departmental events. Other staff provide event support when required.
- b) Yes, the department has a small video production unit. The department produces informational videos to inform and educate the Australian community about the government payments and services it delivers, as well as 'how to' instructional videos to help people access the department's online services. This information is available through our website, on YouTube and across the department's national network of service centres. The department also produces information and training videos for staff.

The then Department of Social Security established the production studio in 1991, which is now located in the Louisa Lawson building in Greenway. Building costs are reported on a whole-of-building basis, which is not possible to break down into this level of requested detail. The department cannot breakdown the ongoing cost of the production studio, as general operating costs, including rent and utilities, cover other units not involved in video production activities.

The unit has four production staff $-3 \times EL1$ and $1 \times APS6$. These staff undertake a range of other public affairs duties and are included in the Divisional staff count of 77.
