Question

Answer

- a) The department has assigned an SES officer to head the deregulation unit and is in the process of determining resourcing for the unit.
 - i) The Government is currently considering arrangements for the implementation of the Deregulation Agenda.
- b) Resourcing for the unit, including staffing levels and classifications, will vary from time to time depending on the volume and nature of the material the unit is required to action. The department has assigned an SES officer to head the deregulation unit.
- c) No additional staff members have been recruited to the department. Resourcing of the unit will occur from internal staff movements.
