## Question:

For 2012-13:
a) How many people receive their income support payments by cheque?
b) Provide a breakdown by payment type of the numbers currently paid by cheque.
c) What it the cost of this method of payment?
d) How many cheques were written for income management-related reasons 2012-13? What was the cost of this?

## Answer:

a) Data regarding the number of customers receiving income support payments via cheque is not available. There were 91,111 cheque payments made in 2012-13. Some people may have received more than one payment via cheque.
b) Numbers by payment type are not available as several income support payments can be made through the same payment system (see Newstart System and Pension System in the table below). The number of cheque payments made, by payment system, is detailed in the table below.

c) The cost per cheque is $\$ 0.97$.
d) There were 592 cheques produced for Income Management reasons. At $\$ 0.97$ per cheque, the total cost in 2012-13 was $\$ 574.24$.
