**Question:**

- a) When was this system introduced?
- b) What are deficiencies of the current system?
- c) What steps are being taken to replace the system?
- d) Can you please provide the amount allocated in the budget (including over the forward estimates) for the replacement or upgrade of the system?

**Answer:**

- a) The Income Support Integrated System (ISIS) was originally built in the late 1980s and has progressively been added to since then.
- b) Increased complexity and lack of flexibility of ISIS has been emerging as a limiting factor in the department's ability to rapidly and efficiently implement government policy changes and other business process changes.
- c) The department is in the early stages of developing a business case for the upgrade or replacement of ISIS. The department commenced work on this initiative in mid-2013 after it was announced in the 2013-14 Budget.
- d) The 2013–14 Budget allocated \$16.225 million over two years to develop the ISIS business case, which has been internally funded through offsets.
