Senator Seselja asked:

Please provide details of the 17 sanctions issued in 2012-13.

Answer:

In 2012–13, the Department issued 17 Notices of Decision to Impose Sanctions to 14 approved providers. Details of sanctions imposed in 2012–13 are listed in the table below.

When applicable, the duration of a sanction is fixed by the Secretary and specified in the notice of decision to impose a sanction.

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
