Senator Ludwig asked:

- a) How many officers have been placed in a unit or taskforce dedicated to meeting the government's red tape reduction targets, and at what level?
- b) How have they been recruited?
- c) What process was used for their appointment?
- d) What is the total cost of this unit?
- e) Do members of the unit have access to cabinet documents?
- f) Please list the security classification and date the classification was issued for each officer, broken down by APS or SES level, in the red tape reduction unit or similar body.

Answer:

- a) As at 11 December 2013, the Department of Social Services (DSS) Deregulation Unit is led by an SES Band 1 who is supported by 3.5 FTE a part-time SES Band 1, an EL1 and two APS6 staff.
- b) DSS officers with suitable skills who expressed interest in joining the unit were transferred to the unit.
- c) The officers were transferred to the unit in accordance with section 25 of the Public Service Act 1999.
- d) The total cost of the unit is yet to be defined as the Government is still considering its requirements for implementation of the deregulation agenda.
- e) Members of the unit have access to Cabinet documents that are relevant to their responsibilities.
- f) The security classifications of staff in the unit are as follows:
