No, this consultancy was not published on the department's Annual Procurement Plan. Consultancies are not generally published in the department's Annual Procurement Plan as the need for specialist services does not become apparent until specific issues or business needs are identified. In addition, Annual Procurement Plans are only used to publish planned procurements of a significant nature to allow the market to prepare for them.

The details of all consultancy contracts entered into valued at \$10,000 and over are reported on the Government's AusTender website. The total expenditure of the department's consultancy contracts is reported in the Annual Report at the conclusion of each financial year.

c) All consultancies established by the department were sourced through Tender processes as noted above. As the consultancies were all under the \$80,000 Commonwealth Procurement Rules threshold, Open Tender processes were not mandatory.
