## Purpose

To review Centrepay policy options to promote the disclosure of effective interest rates for consumer leases offered by Centrepay-approved businesses.

## Key activities and deliverables

The working group will identify, consult on, and report on options that could be introduced through the Centrepay policy and framework, to promote the disclosure to customers of Centrepay-approved businesses of the effective interest rates for consumer leases offered by those businesses.

The working group will consider:

- Ways in which the Centrepay policy and framework could influence the behaviour of Centrepayapproved businesses
- Options for calculation of effective interest rates for consumer leases
- Ways in which effective interest rates could be communicated to consumers
- Any additional changes or proposals arising from the consultations.

The working group is to provide a report on options identified and outcomes from consultation on those options, no later than 31 December 2015. The report will be provided to the Minister for Human Services, who is responsible for Centrepay, by the Department of Human Services. Other agencies participating in the working group may provide the report to other interested ministers for information.

## Protocols and consultation

The working group will:

- meet at least monthly to discuss issues, agree arrangements to pursue the work of the group, and in due course settle its report
- establish a consultation group of business and NGO stakeholders, to invite feedback on options identified and on potential impacts of those options on business and customers
- provide updates to the General Manager, Service Information Division (DHS).

Working group documents are intended to provide a basis for consultation and for subsequent policy considerations. Working group documents should not be assumed to represent policy positions of any participating agency.

The working group will have regard to other possibly relevant processes, including the review of small amount credit contracts to be conducted under section 335A of the *National Consumer Credit Protection Act 2009*, with a view to minimising any duplication of effort.

Any working group member may propose agenda items for the Chair's consideration; papers/briefs are to be lodged not less than one week before the Committee meeting

The agenda and related papers are to be developed by the secretariat and distributed no less than four working days before the scheduled meeting
