Senator POLLEY: There has obviously been some work done by the Bureau of Statistics once again, and they are saying that one in 12 people delays or avoids seeing a specialist because of the cost. Will this ongoing freeze on specialist rebates make that better or worse? Mr Bowles: I do not think you can necessarily link the two issues. The Bureau of Statistics uses a whole lot of data, including socioeconomic data and welfare data and a whole range of things. Without going into the specifics of it and understanding it, I cannot answer your question any further.

Senator POLLEY: If there is anything you can add on notice, that would be very useful. Mr Bowles: We can do that.
