## **Topic: Boards for Departments or agencies with boards**

# Senator Ludwig asked:

Since 7 September 2013;

- 1. How often has each board met, break down by board name;
- 2. What travel expenses are provided;
- 3. What is the average attendance at board meetings;
- 4. How does the board deal with conflict of interest;
- 5. What conflicts of interest have been registered;
- 6. What remuneration is provided to board members;
- 7. How does the board dismiss board members who do not meet attendance standards?
- 8. Have any requests been made to ministers to dismiss board members since 7 September 2013?
- 9. Please list board members who have attended less than 51% of meetings
- 10. What have catering costs been for the board meetings held this year; is alcohol served?

## Answer:

- 1. For the period 1 September 2013 to 31 January 2014, the Australia Post Board met on two occasions for Board and Board Committee meetings (October & December).
- 2. Travel expenses for directors are covered by Australia Post, consistent with the Commonwealth Remuneration Tribunal determinations.
- 3. The Board comprises of nine directors (including the Managing Director & CEO). At the October 2013 meeting, two of the directors were apologies for the meeting, whilst all directors were in attendance for the December meeting.
- 4. Conflicts of Interest are managed in accordance with s21 of the Commonwealth Authorities and Companies (CAC) Act and s29 of the Public Governance, Performance & Accountability (PGPA) Act 2013.
- 5. For the period 1 September 2013 to 31 January 2014, one director declared a potential conflict of interest under s21 of the CAC Act and s29 of the PGPA Act 2013 in relation to a matter, and did not receive the relevant information and did not participate in discussions on that particular matter.
- 6. Remuneration for Australia Post's non-executive directors is determined by the Commonwealth Remuneration Tribunal. From 1 July 2013 these rates were:

Chairman	\$178,940
Deputy chairman	\$99,860
Directors	\$89,500
Audit and Risk Committee chairman	\$20,700
Audit and Risk Committee member	\$10,360

- 7. Termination of appointment of a director is made by the Governor-General in accordance with s79 of the Australian Postal Corporation Act 1989.
- 8. No requests been made to Shareholder Ministers to dismiss board members since 1 September 2013
- 9. No directors have attended less than 51% of Board and Board Committee meetings held during 1 September 2013 to 31 January 2013.
- 10. Australia Post provides refreshments and a light lunch to Directors during each Board Meeting. Alcohol is not served at Board Meetings. On average, the cost of catering expenses for each Board Meeting is approximately \$400.
