Senator Ludwig asked:

Answer:

1. Four reviews have commenced since Supplementary Budget Estimates in November 2013 to end January 2014.

- e. The review will analyse the economic and social costs and benefits arising from the availability of broadband of differing properties via various technologies and make recommendations on the role of Government support and a number of other longer-term industry initiatives.

- h. The Government appointed a Panel of Experts comprising Dr Michael Vertigan AC, Ms Alison Deans, Professor Henry Ergas and Mr Tony Shaw PSM to conduct the review. Dr Vertigan has been appointed as Chair.
- i. The Department has established a secretariat to support the Panel (1 x SES Band 1 officer, 2 x EL2 officers and 1 x APS3 officer). Various other officers in the Department provided input into the review at various times.
- j. The Panel will provide a report to Government within six months (June 2014).
- k. The cost of the review will be met from existing Departmental resources.
- 1. There is no requirement to table the review in Parliament or make it public, this is a matter for Government. The terms of reference, however, include the statutory review of the telecommunication industry access arrangements required under the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010.* The Minister must cause copies of this element of the review to be tabled in each House of the Parliament within 15 sitting days of that House after the completion of the preparation of the report.

The panel members have met with the Minister to discuss their task.

To assist with the Cost-Benefit Analysis and Review of Regulation of NBN, on 28 January 2014, Griffith University was recruited to develop a cost-benefit analysis methodology paper for \$32,889. This is a fixed fee for the element of work. Griffith University was appointed by the Department with no involvement by the Minister or his Office (and to the best of the Department's knowledge the University has not had contact with the Minister or his Office).
