Answer:

1. and 2. The Raising National Water Standards (RNWS) Programme was an Australian Government initiative that supported projects to advance National Water Initiative reforms by improving water management, capacity, knowledge, skills and innovation. The programme was administered by the National Water Commission.

The use of the term 'standards' is used in the context of improving national capacity in water policy and management. The RNWS program supported 178 projects that covered a wide range of issues and themes.
