Dr de Brouwer: it is very hard to say, without some further reflection, whether we have had specific conversations about specific projects. But we do talk about sustainable development, the nature of resources and the nature of environment protection in Australia. **Senator WATERS:** Okay. Can you just provide on notice for me the dates, the locations, the folk present at those meetings and the issues that were discussed, particularly whether or not that included the Galilee coalmines and the Abbot Point expansion. Do you recall—if any of the officers are in the room, hopefully they have a good recollection as well— **Senator Birmingham:** We will take on notice and provide what information can appropriately be provided in that regard.
