- 3. For the Acton site
  - (a) The building provides exhibition space, public areas and office accommodation. Occupancy level not measured, due to the specific purpose of the building to display exhibitions and provide public space.
  - (b) Current value of the Building is \$97,664,000
  - (c) Café and function services provided by a contracted caterer.
- 4. The Museum owns 1 building and leases 3 buildings.
- 5. The building at the Acton site is the National Museum of Australia. The size of the building is 16,459m<sup>2</sup>. The last valuation was at 30 June 2014 and the building value is \$106,805,000.
- 6. Occupancy rate is 4.5%. The remaining space is for exhibitions and public space including café, retail shop and conference facilities available for hire.
