Since the change of Prime Minister on 14 September, 2015:

1. What guidelines are in place to administer grants?
2. How are grants applied for?
3. Are there any restrictions on who can apply for a grant? If yes, please detail.
 - (a) Can these restrictions be waved? If yes, please detail the process for waving them and list any grants where the restrictions were waved.
4. What is the procedure for selecting who will be awarded a grant?
5. Who is involved in this selection process?
6. Does the minister or the minister's office play any role in awarding grants? If yes, please detail.
 - (a) Has the minister or the minister's office exercised or attempted to exercise any influence over the awarding of any grants? If yes, please detail.
7. Provide a list of all grants, including ad hoc, one-off discretionary grants awarded to date. Provide the recipients, amount, intended use of the grants, what locations have benefited from the grants and the electorate and state of those locations.

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Answer:

Australian National Maritime Museum

1. The Australian National Maritime Museum administers the Maritime Museum of Australia Project Support Scheme (MMA PSS). Since the change of Prime Minister on 14 September 2015 – 8 February 2016 the ANMM has opened the 2016-2017 round of MMA PSS funding. The following documents are in place to administer grants:
 - MMA PSS Guidelines
 - 2013 – 2016 Maritime Museums of Australia Project Support Scheme Funding Agreement
2. Grants are applied for by submission of an application form.
3. Applicants are required to meet the eligibility requirements as outlined in the MMA PSS Guidelines.

To be eligible an organisation must:

- *be an Australian legally incorporated not-for-profit organisation, such as a museum, historical society, or community based organisation;*
- *be actively involved in collecting, preserving, interpreting and exhibiting Australia's maritime heritage; and*
- *have a collection that is accessible to the public.*

An organisation is not eligible if:

- *the collection is privately owned;*
- *the collection is not accessible to the public, such as a club where access is restricted to members only;*
- *it is a major national, state or territory collecting institution; or*
- *it has an outstanding acquittal from a previous MMA PSS grant.*

MMA PSS provides funding support for projects and internships that would not be eligible for other sources of funding. Projects and internships deemed eligible to apply for other funding schemes will be considered a low priority.

4. The grants are awarded in a competitive process based on how well the proposal meets the selection criteria.
5. The Selection Committee comprises representatives from the Ministry for the Arts, the ANMM and the maritime heritage community.
