Senator Rice asked:

Senator BACK: In terms of South Australia, it has always been the case that, when an agency is preparing a prescribed burn, there are a number of factors taken into account, one of which is assets of the type. Is there a concern that those preparing the prescribed burns have not sufficiently taken into account the sorts of assets that you are looking to protect?

Mr Knudson: I guess I would answer that in the sense that there is always a concern by the department that we would want everyone to be cognisant of—

Senator BACK: That is the point of my question. My experience for 25 years is that people have always been cognisant, so therefore I am interested to know where there is a specific concern that has not been addressed.

Mr Knudson: I do not believe that we have had a specific concern that we have not addressed. Mr Gaddes can talk more about that.

Mr Gaddes: I could probably give you one recent example in Victoria. I spoke about the widowmakers, where some of the preparatory works before the prescribed burn had cleared a number of trees and we were looking at whether that was at the border of significance, because of some of the hollow-bearing trees and the importance of them. In that area of the world, in Victoria, it is important for the south-east red tailed black cockatoo and some of those species.

Senator RICE: Where was that?

Mr Gaddes: I would have to take that on notice. ...
