# **Topic: Co-location figures**

### **Senator Urquhart, Anne asked:**

- 1. How many of the 499 base stations from Round 1 will have more than one mobile network provider co-locating?
- 2. How many of the base stations from Round 2 will have more than one mobile network provider co-locating?
- 3. Of the 429 base station sites Telstra is building under round one of the Mobile Black Spot Program, how many of these will have co-location of mobile network operators and of the 70 sites that Vodafone is building under Round One, on how many of these will have a co-location of mobile network operators? Please provide details.

#### **Answer:**

- 1. As at 7 April 2017, 61 round 1 base stations are expected to have more than one mobile network provider operating from that base station.
- 2. Under round 2, Mobile Network Operators have a five month period to nominate and negotiate co-location agreements for funded base stations. The outcome of these negotiations will not be known until later in the year. However, co-location can still occur at any time throughout the rollout prior to the base station design and planning approval being finalised.
- 3. Telstra has advised it has received expressions of interest for co-location on 18 of its round 1 base stations. Vodafone has advised that it is progressing co-location at 43 of its round 1 base stations. These numbers may increase or decrease over the life of the program.
