## Senator Urquhart, Anne asked:

In public statements Australia Post have stated that 10,000 workers within Australia Post have been retrained and redeployed across the business. Please provide a breakdown of this figure by:

- (a) Movement numbers between locations within the same state
- (b) Movement numbers between interstate locations
- (c) Numbers transferring between business units and between which business units (please provide breakdown)
- (d) Costings of any relocation allowances paid required by any industrial agreements.

#### **Answer:**

Since implementing our Post People 1<sup>st</sup> program, from July 2014 to 28 February 2017, 9,587 of our existing employees were placed into open vacancies. During this period, the total number of available vacancies was 15,342. This is an average internal fill rate of 62 per cent, which has remained consistent over the past two years. Prior to July 2014, our internal fill rate was approximately 29 per cent.

- (d) Since 1 July 2014, expenses of approximately \$0.5 million have been incurred as a result of relocation allowances paid as required by any relevant industrial agreements.
