Topic: Department restructure

Senator Urquhart asked:

1. The Committee was advised that the new Department structure has six divisions. There are three units in policy areas; one is on infrastructure, one on digital productivity and one focused on consumer and content issues. There are additionally three whole of Department group; the bureau of communication research, the office of the general council and the corporate division that has the usual range of corporate functions. What level of SES officer will head each group?
2. How many staff will be allocated to each of the six organisational groups?

Answer: The table below lists the level of SES officer that leads each division. In addition, the Department has a Deputy Secretary Strategy who does not have direct oversight of a division. This comes into effect on 1 September 2014.
