## ANSWER

The Regulatory Reform Taskforce was set up in October 2013 to progress the accreditation of state and territory assessment and approval processes under the One-Stop Shop election commitment. The taskforce sits within the Environment Assessment and Compliance Division where environmental approvals currently occur under the EPBC Act. Given this context, the information provided below answers all the questions asked on notice.

The Department called for applications for voluntary redundancies 15 April 2014. It is expected that a number of offers will be made by the Department to staff from the Environment Assessment and Compliance Division, in the Regulatory Reform Taskforce.

On 25 June 2014 the Department extended this call for additional applications for voluntary redundancies to COB 30 June 2014. Final numbers will not be known until after the allowable withdrawal date of 31 July 2014.

A commitment has been made by the Commonwealth to provide transitional support to States and Territories in the form of embedded officers, as they transition to the One Stop Shop. This is expected to include embedded officers.

The Division is currently negotiating Bilateral Agreements with all State and Territories, including transitional support that may be available and determining the needs and timing for any embedded officers.

Staff accepting redundancies are expected to leave the Department between July and December 2014.
