## Senator Urquhart asked:

**Senator URQUHART:** He did not refer to buildings; it was Budj Bim, another name. How many properties or areas have been entered on the National Heritage List since the last budget?

**Mr Oxley:** Since the last budget? I will try and get the answer to that before we wrap up. Certainly Broken Hill; there may have been one other. I am just not quite sure.

Mr Johnston: There was nothing since Broken Hill.

**Mr Thompson:** Moree Baths?

Mr Johnston: Moree Baths was just before Broken Hill.

Mr Oxley: There was the Murtoa No. 1 Grain Shed, but I am just struggling to remember

whether that was since the last budget.

**Senator URQUHART:** If you could clarify that it would be good.

Mr Oxley: Yes, I will.

## Answer:

The 2014-15 Budget was brought down on 13 May 2014. Since that date, three places have been included in the National Heritage List:

- City of Broken Hill (NSW) listed 20 January 2015
- Koonalda Cave (SA) listed 15 October 2014
- Murtoa No. 1 Grain Store (VIC) listed 1 October 2014
