Senator O'Neill, Deborah asked:

Senator O'NEILL: Following consultation, on what date was a proposal brief to repeal 11B first

submitted for a decision to the minister?

**Mr Mason:** I would have to take the exact date on notice.

**Senator O'NEILL:** Would you be able to give me a rough date at this time?

**Mr Mason:** Not really. I think I will just take that on notice.

**Senator O'NEILL:** Was it this year or last year? Can you take a general shot in the dark?

**CHAIR:** I think Mr Mason said he would rather take it on notice.

**Senator O'NEILL:** An approximation?

**CHAIR:** I think you have asked that and he has indicated that he is not willing to speculate.

Mr Mason: From memory, the bill was introduced late last year. It would have been some time

last year.

**Senator O'NEILL:** Thank you. And you will give me the date on notice?

Mr Mason: Yes.

#### **Answer:**

The Department provided a range of advice to the Minister and his Office on the Part XIB provisions in the four months to 1 December 2016, the date on which the proposed amendments were introduced in Parliament.
