## Topic: Increase of VPR

Senator Ruston asked:
CHAIR: The increase of the VPR from 60c to 70c-what did that deliver in terms of bottom line modelling on existing postage numbers? What is the net value of the increase?
Mr Fahour: It was only introduced at the beginning of April this year.
CHAIR: What would that increase deliver over 12 months?
Mr Fahour: I would like to take that on notice but I am just going to give you an estimate. We said at a previous estimates hearing that our projection was that it would lower our losses by around $\$ 100$ million. At a previous Senate estimates-I nearly got it right-I said it was about $\$ 95$ million.


#### Abstract

Answer:

The full year impact of the increase to the Basic Postage Rate (BPR) is forecast to be approximately $\$ 87 \mathrm{~m}$ for the 2014/15 financial year.
