Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999

Section 390SM sunsets aspects of Part 15B of the Act 12 months after the Part commences. The Part commenced on 19 September 2012.

Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Amendment (Declared Commercial Fishing Activities) Act 2012

Clean Energy Regulator

Renewable Energy (Electricity) Act 2000

Section 4 of the *Renewable Energy (Electricity) Act 2000* provides that the Act applies to the years commencing 1 January 2001 and to subsequent years however no certificates can be created, and no liability arises, in respect of electricity generated on or after 1 January 2031.
