## **Senator Waters asked:**

How many, if any, organisations listed on the Register are currently under investigation including formal review of their DGR status? Who are they?

## Answer:

The Departments takes a range of compliance actions, which vary based on the circumstances. Compliance action can include informal actions that aim to assist organisations to fully comply with the law or, in the more serious cases, formal actions to remove the organisation from the Register. Depending on the seriousness of the offence, the removal process generally involves two compliance warnings. Organisations are given three months to respond to the warning. In 2013–14, approximately 40 compliance warnings were issued. In 2014–15, to date approximately 10 compliance warnings have been issued. The Department considers the organisation's response to the compliance warning, and takes further action where appropriate.

The Department does not identify organisations subject to compliance action nor comment on them due to privacy considerations.
