Senator Xenophon asked:

Senator XENOPHON: But it seems now that that has been abandoned. Even that encouragement for using recycled paper has been abandoned. I won't use a pejorative term like 'abandoned'. It is no longer in place.

Ms Wiley-Smith: While the ICT plan is no longer in place, there is certainly an encouragement to recycle through the national waste policy.

Senator XENOPHON: But it is not as clear and unambiguous as the previous policy, is it not? **Ms Wiley-Smith**: I would have to take that on notice.

Answer:

- 1. The National Waste Policy is a coherent policy that sets Australia's waste management and resource recovery direction to 2020.
- 2. The ICT Sustainability Plan 2010-15, which has now lapsed and was a guidance document only, encouraged, but did not mandate the use of Australian recycled paper.
- 3. The Digital Transition Policy requires from 2011 that Commonwealth Government departments and agencies move record-keeping activities to digital formats.
 - a. All agencies are expected to comply with the policy by December 2015.
- 4. The Finance Department's Commonwealth Procurement rules ensure environmental sustainability is part of the considerations in achieving the cost-effective use of resources in procurement decisions.
